It has been said that the task of the church is not only to get sinners into heaven, but to get saints out of bed. We may think the first one to be the most difficult, but it is not. Jesus is the only way into heaven. What the church can do is help wake us from our slumber, our contentment with sin, so He *can* lead us through heaven's door. One of the primary goals of the church is to welcome the soul that God has awakened and saved by grace and nurture him or her into a mature disciple of Jesus Christ.

Like sanctification, it is not something that happens in an instant. Discipleship is a process that takes time and effort. Outreach, evangelism, mission and stewardship are overlapping and necessary parts of discipleship. We tend to think that they mean the same thing, but there are some significant differences among them. Outreach is publicity, showing others who we are and who Jesus is by inviting, encouraging and at times even coercing people to enter our doors. Evangelism is meeting spiritual needs by

sharing the story of the cross and God's plan for the redemption of sinners. It is sharing the Good News of the gospel, telling others why Jesus came and how He changes lives, including our own. Mission is meeting the physical needs of others, especially those struggling with the burdens of living in a fallen world. Stewardship is accountability, learning how best to use and share the gifts God has blessed us with individually and as a church to further His kingdom.

Outreach leads to evangelism, and evangelism leads to mission and stewardship, which leads to new disciples. At Millcreek, we recognize the importance of discipleship, for without it the church will not grow. Is there room for improvement? Yes, for we should continue to seek new ways to do things better. Are there groups of people we aren't reaching? How are we meeting extended needs beyond our neighborhoods? Outreach is a major part of the mission of the church, but it is only the first step. We can't stop there. For outreach to be truly successful, spiritual and physical needs will also be met.

We are beginning our Lenten season- a time to pray, to fast, to meditate, to repent and prepare for the celebration of the resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. One of our goals will be to become more purposeful in our discipleship. God gave us His best, His only begotten Son Jesus Christ, in order that we may be saved and spend eternity with Him. It is fitting for us to give Him our best in return. Throughout these forty days, I pray that each of us will search our hearts and our minds and ask ourselves that weighty question Jesus will ask us someday soon. What did you do with the things I have given you? I suggest that the most wonderful of those things is the grace, love and knowledge of Jesus Christ. Let us share Him with love! Pastor Greg
