How quickly things can change. Last year at this time, the Millcreek Community UM Church was still known as YUMTEAM. We were four struggling churches, trusting God to lead us into the wilderness of merger and change. Eight months ago, one leg of our wandering journey ended with a series of charge conferences where we voted to leave the wilderness and enter a promised land of new beginning. We formed a new church, chose a new name and asked God for continued guidance and vision. Our prayers were answered! There have been some setbacks and bumps along the way, but there is no doubt we have been richly blessed with grace and love. We have a strong faith and a resolve to work together to overcome the temptations and ways of the world.

Five weeks ago we began the Lenten season, preparing ourselves for a season of prayer, fasting and penitence. We have a choice to go willingly or be left behind kicking and screaming. Neither option is easy, but one results in blessing while the other ultimately results in loneliness and separation.

During these next several months, it will be critical for us to remain focused on our ministry at Millcreek. One of the ways we can do that is to stay in communication with each other. A new church directory is included with this newsletter with information that will help us make phone calls and send cards and letters of encouragement to each other. We are now video recording our Sunday worship hour and other special services. If you need help in finding them or if you don't have access to the internet, please call the church. We will do our best to help you become "digitally connected" or mail you a DVD of those services every week.

I thank each of you for your patience, for your faith and especially for your generosity during this critical time in the life of the church. I am so thankful for each person who has chosen to go willingly into this new Promised Land. I pray that we will find blessing and encouragement along the way and continue to learn and grow together.
