A famous politician was once asked what her favorite word was. Her response was somewhat surprising, considering some of her political views. "My favorite word? That is really easy. My favorite word is the Word. And that is everything. It says it all for us. And you know the biblical reference, you know the Gospel reference of the Word. And that Word, is, we have to give voice to what that means in terms of public policy that would be in keeping with the values of the Word...fill it in with anything you want. But, of course, we know it means: 'The Word was made flesh and dwelt amongst us.' And that's the great mystery of our faith. He will come again. He will come again. So, we have to make sure we're prepared to answer in this life, or otherwise, as to how we have measured up".

Some of those observations of Speaker of the House Nancy Pelosi are true. The Word is a beautiful word! Though she did not mention the name of Jesus, His name – the name above all names, is the most beautiful name of all. And yes, she is right in saying that the Word was made flesh and dwelt among us, and He will come again. It is the last part of her remarks - "we have to make sure we're prepared to answer in this life, or otherwise, as to how we have measured up", that are troubling.

At first glance, they seem innocent enough. Someday, every one of us we will meet Jesus face to face and answer this question or something similar that He will ask us: What did you do with the gifts and graces I gave you? The problem is that Ms. Pelosi seems to be saying that when we do meet Jesus, we will also need to be prepared to explain just how well we measured up to His standard. That is not Good News. Our human efforts, no matter how noble or good, cannot make us right with God. Only our faith in Christ justifies us and makes us holy and acceptable to God.

There will be no "splainin" to do when Jesus returns. Self- righteousness will not be an option, as there will be no acceptable excuses for not measuring up to the things God expects of us. When we do meet our Lord, we will have two options. We can plead with Him to use a measuring stick other than His Word, (living and written) or plead for mercy in His name for not measuring up. Try as I might, I admit I will have no choice but to choose the latter. Which one will you choose?

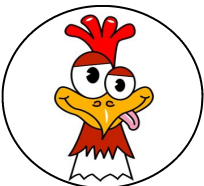

Millcreek Community UMC - Leadership Team Meeting

**May 4, 2021
6:30pm-7:30pm**

Present: Pastor Greg, LK, Barb H., Elaine, Hope, Doc. H., Don, Diane Redfern, Susan Justice

Pastor opened with verses from 1 Peter 3: 8-12

Treasurers Report/Finance:

- Income YTD from identified givers @ \$31,000, majority not physically in church.
- Insurance paid for Richard Brown campus \$ 3000+
- Hope asked for meetings to be moved to the 2nd Tuesday of month for more complete financial statement. This was agreed upon. All bills are paid and accounted for.
- \$256,928.34 in investment fund (as of April 30) and \$293,332.84 in endowment fund
- Approx. \$63,000 expected soon from proceeds of sale of Home Savings shares. Funds will be used to pay for new windows previously approved. \$31,500 will be transferred from investment account to endowment account in accordance with investment policy.

Administrative:

- New Lay Leader? How to select? Does Leadership pick? Do we send out e-mail?
- A discussion on what constitutes a quorum took place., i.e. how many people need to be physically present for an important decision to be made. Pastor Greg explained that due to Covid, the understanding of the word has changed. At Millcreek, leadership team meetings have continued to be held in person following established health protocols. Agendas are sent ahead of time to all team members electronically via email. Those that choose not to attend are kept abreast of church business through meeting minutes, church newsletter and pulpit on Sunday. Regardless of venue or attendance numbers, final administrative decisions that have potential to affect the mission of the church are not made until an opportunity for all team members to offer their input and guidance, either in person, electronic or phone call is offered.

Buildings & Grounds:

- Sale of Youngstown Campus – 80 + people looked at it at first showing. Auction date: Monday, May 24, 2021 @ 4pm (min. bid of \$60,000) Prayers for tenant.
- Millcreek Building – Parking lot needs to be repaired -holes filled, sealed, and striped. Pastor to ask Steve to get bids.
- Sound room to be constructed soon by Steve, Bill? & Pastor - \$1200 collected

Missions:

- \$8,000+in donations received YTD.
- May project: Someplace Safe
- Received \$615 in April & gave \$600 to PFS.
- \$80 collected so far in May.
- May 15 Drive-thru Community Dinner – creamed chicken, etc.
- Food bank distribution at RB may have to relocate to Unitarian Church once building sells.

Worship:

- Still working to fix technical problems with streamed Sunday Worship.

Meeting ended with prayer.
