At times, we live as fearful people. We fear cancer and heart disease, getting old and traffic accidents. We fear terrorist attacks, financial setbacks, violence, and natural disasters. We fear speaking in public, praying in public and offending others by revealing our thoughts and opinions on controversial topics. We fear being disliked and unaccepted by others and tend to live by the unwritten rule that says polite people don't talk about politics

and religion among those we don't know. Often, fear is behind our silence. Certainly no one wants a swastika painted on their door, a cross burned in their yard, or a bounty offered for their head for voicing an opinion. It is safer and easier to remain silent than risk becoming the victim of ostracism, violence, or ridicule. Fear is quite effective and yet at times it can be part of God's will. The great reformer Martin Luther once wrote this about it: "God and the devil take opposite tactics in regard to fear. The Lord first allows us to become afraid, that he might relieve our fears and comfort us. The devil, on the other hand, first makes us feel secure in our pride and sins, that we might later be overwhelmed with fear and despair".

Overcoming fear is part of the Christian life and it seems we have a choice. Will it be fear and comfort or fear and despair? Fear and assurance now or fear and doubt later? Even great prophets like Jeremiah had to choose. A quick look at the opening verses of the book that bears his name reveals he had a case of the doubts. It appears he was praying to the Lord, maybe even desperately reaching out for a sign that He was still on the throne. Perhaps he was praying for guidance, wondering what he could do or say to make God known to the people of Judah. Whatever it was he was praying for, God answered him in no uncertain terms. "Do not be afraid of their faces, for I am with you...."

Yes Jeremiah, I AM here. Why do you have fears and doubts? Need I remind you that I am responsible for your being here? Would it help you to know that I had plans for your birth and your life before your parents even thought about you? Have you forgotten that everything I create is special? I wouldn't create you and then abandon you. I have chosen you and set you apart to do something special for my sake.

Those paraphrased words of God to an Old Testament prophet named Jeremiah are also for you and me and other followers of Jesus Christ. Like Jeremiah, we too are chosen, created, and called to do something special for God- to set ourselves aside and glorify Him, to put our will aside and do His will. No excuses and no doubts allowed! We will not be afraid of their faces when we speak truth in love. We will not fear the strange looks, rolled eyes, and veiled insults that may come when we share our faith and love for Jesus and speak against deceit and division.

We may not have all of the power that God granted to Jeremiah, but every Spirit-filled believer has what is sufficient. When those times of fear and despair begin to fill our minds with doubt, we must remember what God told Jeremiah. I knew you when you hadn't even taken a breath or spoke a single word. Do not be afraid, for I am with you. I love you.

If you need more encouragement, consider this promise Jesus made to His followers: "Lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age". He is the everlasting God. He is our light and salvation. Whom shall we fear? Whom shall we be afraid? We will wait on You! We will trust in You!




