Prayer is one of the foundations of Christian living, a way we put our beliefs into action. Prayer is an act of worship, a means of drawing near to God, and a powerful agent of change. We pray for many reasons and for many things, and one of the most common is for peace. We seek peace in our own lives and in the lives of others, peace in the

church and peace in the world. We pray because we believe the promises of Scripture that say Jesus will bring us peace. Jesus reminded His early disciples, and He reminds us that the true peace He brings is not the same as peace in the world. Peace of a social or worldly nature is the absence of conflict and war, a tranquil and serene state of being where violence and bloodshed are replaced with love, compassion, and kindness. His peace, true peace, is overcoming fear, specifically the fear of evil, death, and divine judgment. True peace is everlasting. By its very nature, worldly peace will always be temporary.

The lack of peace is not a social problem, but a spiritual one. It is a visible sign of something we can't easily see, a symptom of a damaged heart. It is true that worldly peace begins with establishing Biblical moral values through legislation and law and order, but those things alone cannot bring about the lasting peace we desire. Peace among people cannot come until people seek peace with God. More two thousand years ago, Jesus came to earth in love to show us how and where to find it. After His crucifixion and resurrection, He left His Holy Spirit behind to equip and prepare one unique group of people to pick up where He left off. That group includes you and I, His church. Our role in helping the world find peace is twofold. We help people understand that personal sin prevents us from living in peace, and we show the world that sin is only overcome by love and forgiveness in Jesus Christ. His love for us, fallen people that we are, and our love for Him will one day overcome fear and violence. Jesus brings true peace.

Those in the world will continue to seek peace without Christ, even going so far to blame Christianity, the Scriptures or God for the failure to find it. But what good is that peace if we will not have peace in the world to come? We know better. We know the truth will set us free from sin and fear. We have the choice, the means, and the power to live peacefully. Indeed, it is more than a choice, for the Scriptures reveal it is a command to God's people: Pursue peace with all people, and holiness, without which no one will see the Lord. (Hebrews 12:14) The relationship between peace and holiness is unmistakable and undeniable. A world without holiness is a world without peace. Let us earnestly help the world find both while there is still time.


