It is often said that history repeats itself and the headlines of today reveal that to be true. Although the names, places, and events may be different, the fallen nature of the world and our response to it has not changed. Today we have no less desire than those who lived many years before us to divert ourselves from painful things that threaten to sadden us, anger us, and steal our joy. The problem is that many of the diversions and solutions the world

offers are harmful alternatives. The New York Times recently reported that a record number of people in the US died from substance abuse between April 2020 and April 2021(100,000+). Statistics also reveal that suicide rates have soared among teens to an all -time high. Mental health professionals are now discovering that loneliness and isolation resulting from fear of Covid 19 were a contributing factor in both. That should come as no surprise to us, for history shows that great harm always comes to society when the social structures that God has designed and gifted to humanity are disrupted or corrupted.


Christians are not immune. Like the rest of society, Christians can be misled and become fearful people. We fear Covid, cancer, heart disease, Alzheimer's, and traffic accidents. We fear terrorist attacks, financial setbacks, violence, and so-called natural disasters. We fear speaking in public, praying in public and at times worshiping in public. Fearing ridicule, chastisement, or financial loss, we are often afraid to speak up or speak out about our faith and trust in Jesus Christ and the love we have for His church. And when we do, we may find ourselves silenced on social media platforms that actively censor long-held traditional Christian views. Fear is a powerful and effective means of silence and control, and Satan uses it to lead people away from the truth.

Fear can keep us from growing in our faith. There will also be times when something much less obvious yet equally effective will be at work. A quick look at the discussion God had with the OT prophet Jeremiah will have us recognize it. One of the unique things about Jeremiah is that he honestly revealed much of his personal thoughts and emotions in his writings. Some are so obvious that he is often referred to as "the weeping prophet". Thankfully cancel culture was not around in his day! In the book that bears his name, we find that his problem was not despair or fear, but a very close cousin called doubt. Like fear, it has been around for a very long time.

Even so, it didn't keep him from praying. Perhaps desperately reaching out to God for a sign that He was still there, Jeremiah prayed, and God answered him in no uncertain terms. God told him "I knew you before you took a breath or spoke a single word. Do not be afraid, for I am with you" (Jeremiah 1:5). That is another way of saying "have no fear because I love you!". Jesus told His followers something similar moments before He left earth: "Lo, I am with you *always*, even to the end of the age". (Matthew 28:20) Fear and doubt are not new enemies. When they threaten our minds and spirit, let us remember His promise and the words of the Psalmist in Psalm 23. "Yea, thou I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil". Let us always be faithful and careful, but never fearful. Jesus will not lead us astray!
