

How long shall I cry for help, and you will not hear? Or cry to you Violence! and you will not save? Why do you make me see iniquity, and idly look at wrong? Those same questions the prophet Habakkuk boldly asked of God more than 2600 years ago are still being asked

today. Like Habakkuk, followers of Jesus are living squarely in the midst of a godless society. We cry out to God and government about the senseless violence in our communities and wait to hear a response. We wonder how a nation that claims to be living under God's divine providence would allow the lives of 40 million children to be destroyed in the name of free choice. We question why pedophiles with criminal records several pages long are freed from prison to harm again and why 175 people in the US die every day from Fentanyl. We grieve as divine gifts of family, marriage, and sexual intimacy are reimagined to be something God clearly says they are not. Some wonder if Satan is in control, others say God's divine judgment is being poured out per Romans 1:28. Perhaps both are correct. At times, we are like Habakkuk, Job, or Francis Scott Key, sitting on the ramparts in the twilights last gleaming, searching for a glimpse of hope- a sign that the God of the Scriptures is still on the throne and that good will triumph over evil when the battle is over.

Before you throw your hands in the air and give in, find your Bible, and read what God had to say to Habakkuk and what He has to say to us in the Old Testament book that bears the prophet's name. The gist of it is this: trust me that there is a plan in place that will satisfy My need and your yearning for justice. Wait for it, it will come. Be assured, I am still on the throne in my holy temple! To use a contemporary saying, God said I've got this!

Father, Son and Holy Spirit, the God that spoke the entire universe into existence, the God that knew our name before the beginning of creation and the God that knows the exact number of hairs on every head, is also the God that is keenly aware of each and every difficult or evil situation in the world. Our humble response must be like that of the prophets, a prayerful plea for mercy for all facing great imminent wrath. Our Lord desires all to come to repentance (2 Peter 3:9), which means we will have to persevere or even suffer in this world for a season until His plan is complete. Even so, the righteous shall live by faith. May that number increase! I pray our faith in Jesus and His word will see us through the storms that are upon us and for His Holy Spirit to keep us together.
