When we study the gospel accounts of the many miracles that Jesus performed in his ministry, we find that many of them also involved a dispute with the Pharisees and other religious leaders of the day. In turn, if we study the disputes that took place, we also find that many of them centered on the traditions of the Sabbath. With all of their various interpretations of the Law, the Pharisees took the Sabbath, which God meant to be a blessing to man, and turned it into a burden.

One Sabbath day, Jesus went into the synagogue to teach, and a man was there whose hand was shriveled. The Pharisees and the teachers of the law were looking for a reason to accuse Jesus, so they watched him closely to see if he would heal on the Sabbath. But Jesus knew what they were thinking and said to the man with the shriveled hand, "Get up and stand in front of everyone." So he got up and stood there. Then Jesus said to them, "I ask you, which is lawful on the Sabbath: to do good or to do evil, to save life or to destroy it?" He looked around at them all, and then said to the man, "Stretch out your hand." He did so, and his hand was completely restored. The man was happy, but the Pharisees were furious!

Are we to conclude that Jesus was teaching it is OK to break the Sabbath? The obvious answer is no, and to understand why, we will need to look at what Scripture says about the topic. The command to keep the Sabbath was first recorded in Exodus 20. "Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy....for in six days the Lord made the heavens and the earth, the sea, and all that is in them, but He rested on the seventh day." God created the world in 6 days and rested on the seventh- not because God was tired but because He knew that people like you and I would need a day apart from work, a special day to worship with other believers and take rest from our labors.

Jesus made it a priority to be in worship on the Sabbath, and so should we. Our week is not the same without it. Some of us have to work on Sunday, and God honors that need to provide for our families. However, another time set apart for God is necessary for our spiritual and physical health. Holy means to set apart or set aside, and whether our Sabbath is Sunday or another day of the week, when we set time aside to honor Jesus and spend time with Him, healing of many different kinds will come. Remember the Sabbath! God created it for good reason, so let us do our best to keep it holy! Pastor Greg




# The Message of a Methodist


