Throughout history, there has always been a remnant of God's people who have remained faithful and obedient to the Scriptures. The book of Nehemiah tells a story of a faithful remnant, hard work, and new beginnings, and it brings us hope as we celebrate our new identity as the Millcreek Community Methodist Church. God is good, and if the temple walls of Jerusalem were able to be rebuilt in 52 days in the days of Nehemiah, certainly we can be encouraged and find strength to accomplish what God has asked us to do for His glory at Millcreek in 2023 and beyond. God was pleased with Nehemiah and the others involved in rebuilding the temple, but not for the reason we might expect. Certainly, God was pleased that they had rebuilt the temple, but He was even more pleased that they yearned to hear Him speak through the Scriptures. God did speak, and God's people heard and then sought forgiveness and restoration for their sinful ways. A revival soon followed.

Today, a growing number of those living in the 21<sup>st</sup> century believe that the Bible is passé and out of date, no longer relevant for today. On the few occasions they do turn to the Scriptures, they don't expect to hear God speak. Surprisingly enough, the people in Nehemiah's day tended to believe the same thing. The Scriptures were little more than words on a scroll until the day they gathered as one people expecting and desiring to hear God's voice. It wasn't until they began to expect to hear God speak that they became a changed people. What keeps us from expecting to hear God speak? What is it that might keep us from growing in our faith?

There are many possibilities. Some of us just do not know how to begin, others do not make it a priority, and still others think they are all done growing! Trying to become more faithful without depending upon the Holy Spirit and the church to help is like trying to get your car unstuck from a snowdrift without calling a tow truck. More often than not, you will spin your wheels and ruin your transmission. If you want to learn how to sew, ask a modiste (look it up!) to show you how. If you want to learn how to fix cars or cook a gourmet meal, ask a mechanic or a chef. If you want to become more faithful to Jesus, get involved in one of the small groups at Millcreek. Holy Grounds Cafe, our mission team, our music team, and Wednesday Bible study are all great places to start. When we expect to hear God's voice when we read or hear others read the Scriptures, God will not disappoint us. That is true even when it is one of those passages we have heard many times in the past or one with names and places we cannot pronounce. When we desire to hear, understand, and believe God's Word, God will speak, and we will grow in our faith and our (His) church will grow stronger. When that happens God will be pleased.....and so will we. Let us see how pleased we can be! Pastor Greg




