

Mission and Methodism have been inseparable since the founding of the Methodist church. John Wesley, one of the founders of the Methodist movement, had much to say about mission and our responsibility as members of Christ's church.

Here are just a few of his quotes related to mission gleaned from his sermons:

- "Do all the good you can, by all the means you can, in all the ways you can, in all the places you can, at all the times you can, to all the people you can, as long as ever you can."
- "You have nothing to do but to save souls. Therefore, spend and be spent in this work. And go not only to those that need you, but to those that need you most. It is not your business to preach so many times, and to take care of this or that society; but to save as many souls as you can; to bring as many sinners as you possibly can to repentance." (Note: this is not just for pastors!!!)
- "God grant that I may never live to be useless!"

How relevant and applicable these words are for us today! Church revitalization comes when we are involved in mission, a word that means to **be sent**. As we say good-bye to the United Methodist Church and hello to the Global Methodist Church, let us make these words of John Wesley our own: "I continue to dream and pray about a revival of holiness in our day that moves forth in mission and creates authentic community in which each person can be unleashed through the empowerment of the Spirit to fulfill God's creational intentions." Let us be reminded that his dream did not become a reality until he moved far beyond his beloved Church of England. Disagreement and division are good things when God and holiness is in the midst of them.

Your prayers, presence, and support are all needed if we are to make that dream a reality once again. More than one revival happened in Wesley's day and by many indications it seems the time is right for righteousness and restoration to sweep over the land again. The writer of Hebrews reminds us "without holiness, no one will see the Lord", and it is God's plan for the world to see Him through the mission of faithful people like you and me through churches like Millcreek. Truth matters and holiness matters, and we will not deviate from either. Let us learn from the past, prepare for the future, and give God glory and praise while doing it! Pastor Greg
