Many of us have experienced the results of violating a basic rule of economics-if we spend more than we have, invariably we will soon become indebted to someone or something. A second rule is that those who keep spending more than they have will likely go bankrupt. When it comes right down to it, economics is a matter of distribution. For thousands of years, people have been trying to figure out how limited resources can be used in such a way that our own needs and the needs of others are met. It is a well -known fact that there is enough food in the world to feed everyone who is hungry. Hunger and poverty are not matters of supply or consumption, but a matter of distribution. Whether one thinks capitalism or socialism is the best answer to the problem, greed and laziness will always prevent a positive outcome.

The disciples of Jesus faced a similar problem with distribution on the side of a mountainside in Galilee one day. There were thousands of hungry people in their midst and a small amount of food in which to feed them. It was nothing they hadn't seen before. Great crowds had followed Jesus from place to place because they had heard that He was a great doctor, someone who could heal them of their infirmities and cure them of their diseases. You might imagine there was pushing and shoving to get the opportunity to be near Jesus, and by the end of the day the disciples had had their fill of it. They were thinking they should send the people on their way since there did not seem to be enough food to feed everyone. After all, didn't Jesus say the poor will always be with us? Tomorrow is another day. It seems they forgot that Jesus was the master of multiplication.

Leaving people hungry wasn't an option for Jesus. He didn't send part of the crowd home so that there would be enough food to feed the few that were left. He didn't take the 5 loaves and two fish and give each person in the crowd a tiny crumb in order to say that He fed them. Jesus did what was right- He taught the disciples to trust in God rather than themselves and believe that what they already had would be sufficient to meet the needs of those who were among them. They soon found that what they had was not only sufficient, but it was also more than sufficient. Five loaves and two fish fed about 8000 people and yet there were 12 baskets left over, exactly enough for each of the twelve disciples to have a late evening snack.

It is true that God can multiply what we already have if we are faithful and willing to share it. (See Proverbs 11:24 and 28:20) That Biblical principle is so important that the account of the loaves and the fish was recorded for us by all 4 gospel writers. Unlike so many things of today, the feeding of the multitudes was no fabricated or staged event. The disciples learned a lesson in distribution and meeting the needs of the crowds more than 2000 years ago, and it is one that the 21st century disciples continue to learn today. God has a way of taking what we think is impossible and making it possible! Let us be reminded that Jesus is still in the miracle business, adjust our way of thinking and go in faith to feed the minds and bellies of the multitudes. - Pension plan payment details to be worked out SPR meeting on July 23 after worship with net savings to church \$2900.00

- Parking lot needs resealed. Steve or Bill to get quotes.
- New Millcreek Global Methodist sign face has been installed on LED sign in front yard.


