And the nations will know that I am the Lord, declares the Lord God, when through you I vindicate my holiness before their eyes. Even though the Scriptures record that God spoke those words to a man named Ezekiel more than 2600 years ago, His purpose for saying them has not changed, and it is that God wants all people to know that He is Lord over all. Ezekiel was a priest and a prophet, a great messenger and deliverer of the word of God to the people of God. The OT book bearing his name is much like the book of Revelation, filled with symbolism, prophecies, signs of coming judgment and visions of God's holiness. In that book Ezekiel is referred to a "watchman" (3:17). Today, we might think of a watchman as an armed guard protecting a Brinks truck or a night guard making his rounds checking for possible intrusions. But Ezekiel's job was not to guard a pile of money or a fancy building, but to watch over and keep God's holy reputation intact. Much like a sentinel that warns residents of a castle of impending danger, Ezekiel was given a direct command from God to relay a message to His people. It was actually more of a warning than a message. People must repent, seek forgiveness, and turn from their sins or perish.

That message may be found in several other places in the Bible, from Genesis through Revelation. Chronicles 7:14 is one of many examples. At first glance it does sound harsh, yet upon further examination we must admit that it is filled with grace. Unless they are warned of impending doom, people will die in their sin, and it is God's will that people be warned. It is also God's will that His people find the truth and be saved. God appointed Ezekiel to be the watchman to deliver His warning then, and today that warning is still echoing in the hills, amplified by the lips of John the Baptist and our Lord Jesus Christ. When God has a message to deliver, He will see that it gets delivered.

The good news is that God desires that all should come to saving faith in His Son Christ. (see Ezekiel 18:23 and 1 Timothy 2:4) He is not sleeping on the job while evil marauders invade the castle but is carefully and patiently calling and redeeming His people who are called by His name. As with Ezekiel, God has entrusted people like you and I in the new Global Methodist Church to help sound the alarm and point the way to safety. Let us be diligent in our calling, as there is also a warning within the warning God sent through Ezekiel that remains in effect today. Those who have the key to the kingdom, those who know the truth, will be held accountable by God if they fail to watch over it. Let us stand guard with all of our might. Pastor Greg




