

If we are honest with ourselves, we will likely admit that some of life's most challenging lessons come when we are faced with the reality that we aren't in charge. For some of us, that realization came at a young age when a parent, grandparent or older sibling limited our freedom to do something we wanted to do. Others experience it in the workplace or when a life- threatening disease is discovered. No matter what our position in life is, the reality is that every person is ultimately in submission to an authority somewhere. Making Jesus our Lord is believing our place in His kingdom is secured by His sacrifice, not ours. Making Jesus our Lord is having trust and faith that everything He asks us to do or even commands us to do in His earthly kingdom prepares us to become the best we can be in His heavenly kingdom. 
