During this special time of the year, as we prepare our hearts and our homes for the coming of Christ, we can easily get caught up in the busyness and business of the season and overlook some of the signs and symbols of the season that will help us see Jesus. The star is one of them. In the OT Book of Numbers 24:17, we find that a star representing the first coming of Jesus was foretold. A prophet named Balaam said this about the coming Savior Messiah: "I see Him, but not now. I behold Him, but not near. A star shall come out of Jacob". The interesting thing is that the prophet was no friend of the Israelites and would eventually betray them to the Moabites by enticing them into idolatry and sexual sin. God even uses the wicked for His eternal purposes! Those of us living in the 21st century know for certain that star did come, for two thousand years later these words of Jesus were recorded by the apostle John in Revelation 22:14. "I am the root and the offspring of David, the bright and morning star.

The carols and hymns we sing this time of year also help us to see Jesus. Christmas carols were first written to help people who couldn't read tell and retell the story of Christ in a way that was simple and easy to remember. Today we hear them so often that by the time Christmas Eve arrives we miss much of their beauty and meaning. The First Noel tells the Christmas story found in Luke and Matthew's Gospels. The first verse recalls that an angel told the shepherds of the good news- born is the King of Israel. Verse two tells of a special star, one that gave great light. The story of that star is found in the Gospel of John, where we learn that Jesus is the light of the world that first began to shine that day so long ago in Bethlehem. Shepherds and wise men alike saw the star, and followed it wherever it went. Wise men and women still follow that star of Christmas today.

We are immersed in a culture that has little trouble identifying stars in the form of Hollywood actors and famous athletes while failing to see the Star that promises to bring change to the world. If we are not careful, we will do the same. Let us never forget the real star of Christmas, the one who humbly came to change lives and change the world. The true Star of the world, the eternal Star of the universe, is none other than Jesus, God revealed to us in human form. If you look for Him, you will find that He is with us! Emmanuel, Jesus the Christ. Let us find Him, follow Him, and then worship Him by sharing His love with each other, now and in the times to come. Merry Christmas! PG

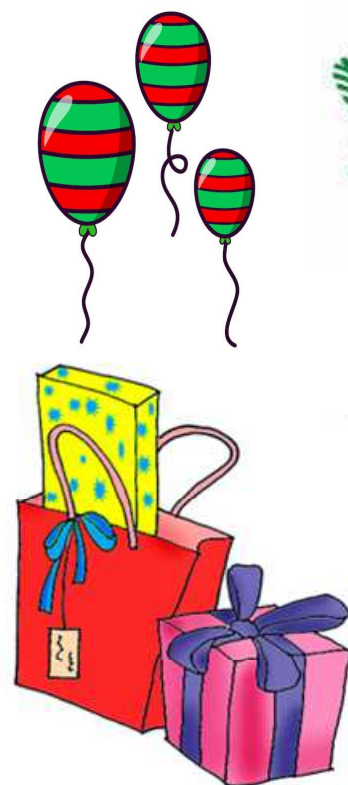
