

Hymnwriter Elisha Hoffman, (who once served a church in Napoleon, Ohio) asks a series of pointed questions in one of his best-known hymns. Are you washed in the blood of the Lamb? Have you been to Jesus

for the cleansing power? Are you fully trusting in His grace this hour? Are you walking daily by the Savior's side? Do you rest each moment in the Crucified? Will your soul be ready for the mansions bright? John Wesley was known for asking something similar. Are you living in inward and outward holiness? Is your faith in Jesus refining and perfecting your love? Those who answer yes to those questions need not fear the horrific judgment of God described in Revelation 6-20. The wrath of the lamb is a terrible thing, but the blood of the lamb washes away sin and the sting of death from those who repent and believe in the Gospel. The blood of the lamb makes us holy and makes us fit for heaven. That is the good news of the gospel. If we are to believe it, we must also believe the bad news of Good Friday.

On that day, Jesus' death shook the world apart, but His resurrection brought a promise that He would put it back together again. Revelation 21 gives us a glimpse of what it will be like. Humanity, illness, and disease can steal our life away now, but the good news is that we know that there is One, only one, who has demonstrated the power to give it back. His name is Jesus. That is good news, and it gets even better! Not only did Jesus rise from the dead but He chose you and I to rise with him. The question is why? Why would he choose sinful people like you and I and offer us not just life but a perfect life after death, one free of pain, heartache, and sin? The answer is simple: because He loves us. Certainly nothing we have done or will do merits that kind of love. It is only by His grace that we are saved and because of the resurrection what was once a mystery is a mystery no more. We no longer need fear the grave.

Even so, the spiritual battle with Satan that began in the Garden of Eden continues to be fought. However, we know how that holy war ends. The Scriptures tell us that we will join Jesus and celebrate His victory at the end of the age. Considering that, let us live as people that are being raised from the dead instead of dying as people overcome by fear and unbelief. Let us continue to share His story- and our story- of how the Risen Christ has changed our lives forever. Let's share it with those that we love and with those that we are learning to love- in order that we might be for the world the body of Christ, redeemed and made alive by His blood. Christ is risen! He is alive, and so are we! Pastor Greg

Our church family has provided \$450 to \$500 worth of medications to these people who cannot get medication at the military stores.


