By the time this article reaches most of you the first three weeks of the 2024 Lenten season will have passed. As we look ahead to Holy Week and the joyful promises of Resurrection Sunday, it is a good time to reflect upon the writings of the prophet Isaiah. One of the greatest of the Old Testament prophets, his credentials as a spokesman for God were firmly established by several prophecies he recorded that were fulfilled in his lifetime. He accurately told of the defeat of some of Israel's greatest enemies, and even told how one of those kings would die. He accurately told of the Lord's healing of King Hezekiah's illness months before it took place. Long before Cyrus became King of Persia, Isaiah revealed that he would be the one to deliver Judah from Babylonian captivity. Isaiah 53 contains perhaps the clearest OT revelation of the coming crucifixion of Jesus Christ. Certainly, such a prophet merits our eye and our ear, as we can learn much from his ancient writings.

Isaiah 42:6 is no exception. It is a most important passage for us modern Christians, as it establishes the reason that God sent our Lord and our guide Jesus Christ to dwell on this earth for a brief period some 2000 years ago. In this most sacred verse, Isaiah records a promise that God made with him (and to Jesus). "I, the Lord, have called you in righteousness, and will hold your hand; I will keep you and give you as a covenant to the people, as a light to the Gentiles". That promise of God was kept, as the writings of Isaiah remain part of the modern Hebrew Bible, and they illuminate the coming of Jesus Christ like no other OT prophet.

God called Isaiah in righteousness and God called His Son Jesus in righteousness. God called Isaiah to be a promised light to the Gentiles, and God sent His Son to be that promised light. God's promise is that Jesus Christ will be given to His people, and that promise is irrevocable. It can't be taken back. Jesus Christ will remain with us forever to be our light and guide, in other words to open our eyes to God's way, to free us from the prison of our sin. Throughout the ages of time, Gentile and Jew alike can know God through His Son Jesus Christ and understand what He desires and demands from us.

It is not wrong to believe that God's promises of Isaiah 42:6-7 also extend to us. As part of Christ's church, God calls us to righteousness (holiness!) and to be light in a world of great darkness. We are found righteous through the work of Jesus on the cross. Great light comes when that truth is boldly proclaimed. The assurance that God keeps His promises is found in the empty cross of Jesus Christ and the glory of Resurrection Sunday. His cross is empty, but His promise is not. Jesus died to make us holy and to free us from the prison of death. Let us recommit ourselves to sharing that truth bountifully and gracefully. Amen.
