

Of all the sermons John Wesley wrote and preached in his lifetime, perhaps none was as controversial as the one he entitled "Christian Perfection". He based it upon the Apostle Paul's words to the Philippians in 3:12 "Not

that I have already attained, or am already perfected; but I press on, that I may lay hold of that for which Christ Jesus has also laid hold of me". Wesley believed the Scriptures taught that it was possible and indeed should be the goal of every Christian to achieve perfection in his or her lifetime. He certainly recognized how that teaching could cause considerable controversy. Hence his opening paragraph: "There is scarce any expression in Holy Writ which has given more offence than this. The word *perfect* is what many cannot bear. The very sound of it is an abomination to them. And whosoever *preaches perfection* (as the phrase is,) that is, asserts that it is attainable in this life, runs great hazard of being accounted by them worse than a heathen man or a publican".

Christian perfection can be a great stumbling block for those who always believed and understood that nobody is perfect. Of course, we know that God alone is perfect, and we certainly can't make ourselves equal to God. The fact is that Wesley was not suggesting that at all. Later in his sermon he said this: "Christian perfection, therefore, does not imply (as some men seem to have imagined) an exemption either from ignorance or mistake, or infirmities or temptations. Indeed, it is only another term for *holiness*. They are two names for the same thing. Thus every one that is perfect is holy, and every one that is holy is, in the Scripture sense, perfect. Yet we may, lastly observe that neither in this respect is there any absolute perfection on earth".

There is a glimmer of hope in those words, because before Wesley defined what a perfect Christian was, he first defined was a perfect Christian wasn't. Perfect Christians are not free from ignorance. Even a perfect Christian will find it impossible to know all there is to know about God. Even a perfect Christian may be mistaken when they interpret and apply Scripture to their lives. And because of the fall, even a perfect Christian may have physical infirmities and a less than perfect ability to reason and make decisions. We will make mistakes because of those flaws. And yes, even perfect Christians will still face temptation from time to time as they live their lives. Christian perfection is a process, the process of becoming everything God created us to be through love. God loves us, we respond to His love through the love of Jesus Christ, He empowers us by the Holy Spirit, we love Him more and more and as a result we sin less and less. Because of His love we then love others and become more and more like Him until some day we find our ourselves....perfect! Until then, let us continue to pray for His help! PG


