Doesn't it seem that it was a long time ago that we were told that the year 2000, the beginning of a new century, would bring indescribable chaos and turmoil to the world? Some were so consumed with fear that they built bunkers and stockpiled large supplies of food, water, flashlight batteries and other necessities required to sustain life. Others simply dismissed all the hype and hoopla and went about their daily routines without cause for alarm, believing that it would be just another day on the calendar. A few minutes after midnight, the latter were proved to be right as God blessed humanity with His grace once again.

Twenty-five years later we marked the beginning of another new year, this time with a different kind of fear upon us. The fear of an invisible threat triggered by a ticking clock at midnight has been replaced by fear of an invisible threat called artificial intelligence (AI), something few of us can even explain. Much like Y2K, AI is said by some to be the greatest danger to humanity since the development of the atomic bomb, likening it to an anti-Christ promising eternal artificial life. Others believe it is a powerful gift from God, one with great potential in helping scientists and doctors find cures for cancer and other deadly disease. Like Y2K, only time will tell whether fear of AI is warranted or ridiculed. What we can be sure of is that AI will not bring lasting happiness to the world or change God's timetable for our lives. In fact, despite technology and intelligence humanity continues to drift farther and farther away from the image of God in which we were created, and the farther people drift the unhappier they become.

Genuine happiness (joy!) does not come from intelligence, knowledge or circumstances but from faith in Jesus Christ. Long before AI, John Wesley once said, "the more holy we are upon earth the more happy we must be". He is not implying we must "act happier" as we become more holy, but that holiness brings us happiness. That means we can be holy and happy, unholy and unhappy, perhaps even unholy and happy (for a time!) but never holy and unhappy. That is especially true for those of us who claim to know Jesus Christ as our Savior. We will have moments of despair and distress because we live in a sinful and fallen world, but unhappiness is never the norm.

As we begin a new year together let us resolve to choose happiness and holiness over fear and pessimism. When unhappiness or unholiness threatens to weaken our faith or damage or destroy a relationship with someone we are called to love, let us stop for a moment or two or three and remember the love of Christ. He chose to die for us because He loved us. That love has the power to change lives- even our own. Stay holy and happy! Pastor Greg
