We can be so proud of our accomplishments and successes that we refuse to admit that we are lost, trusting ourselves to find the way instead of our Lord Jesus Christ. Whether we choose to admit or not, we are lost until we acknowledge our sins, ask Him for help and forgiveness and place our faith and trust in Jesus Christ. Once we do that, the broken relationship is restored. We become a new creation in lesus.

During this blessed and refreshing season of the year remember your baptism and your new birth. Allow the sights and smells of spring to remind you of new life and take a moment or two and remember the excitement of getting unlost, finding your way and trusting in Jesus for forgiveness for the first time. Then while it is still fresh in your mind tell someone else about how Jesus made you a new person-not some recycled version of the old but a brandnew creation. Promise yourself and Jesus you will do that in the month of May.




