

Growing up in the "country" I spent many a day on my grandparents farm, making hay, cleaning the barn, mending fences and hiking through the orchard in search of blackberries and elderberries. Our home was not a particularly exciting place to live, except for those times when the phone would ring and my mother would hear one of the neighbors yelling in broken English "your cows are out again". Now that I think about it, we didn't spend a whole lot of time fixing fences. There are two key words that need further explanation- "your and again". The fact of the matter was they were not my mother's cows or our cows- they belonged to my grandparents. I am not sure whether it was through ignorance or convenience, but it seemed like we were always the first people on the list to be called. The second key word is again, and it was the right word for the cows getting out was a common occurrence. It was no minor emergency, as a herd of thousand-pound animals can do immense damage to lawns and gardens, especially when the ground is soft. At the time, it didn't really matter whose cows they were, something had to be done. The cows had to be herded back to the pasture and the breach in the fence had to be repaired. Though cows and people can live in harmony, boundaries are necessary to do so; in this case a physical boundary- a fence- is required to keep order. We do live in an unsafe world and there will be times and places where boundaries are necessary to maintain order. Romans 13 teaches that respect for governments and political borders are part of God's plan for peaceful living.

But what about cultural fences, racial fences, religious fences, political fences and economic fences? They are more effective in separating and dividing people than any physical fence. Not only do they isolate people, they separate people from God. What causes us to put up these kinds of barriers? The answer lies within the sins of selfishness and envy. People have drifted away from God or even worse completely shut Him out of their lives. That void is quickly filled with things of the world, which result in unholy fences separating people from each other. Instead of seeking fellowship and communion with God and each other, (love God and love neighbor!) the priority becomes privacy and isolation from those who outwardly appear to be different from us. As followers of Jesus, we must do our best to reverse that trend. The good news is that most people do want to love their neighbor, they just don't know how. Now is the time for people to return to God. The harvest is great! Let us show them how to pick by remembering this truth: The closer we are to Jesus, the easier it will be for us to love our neighbor. Pastor Greg
