

We are fallen people living in a fallen world, and as a result there will be times when many of us will ponder the questions the prophet Habakkuk boldly asked of God more than 2600 years ago. Why do evil people win in their fight against good people? Why do you make me look at these terrible things? Habakkuk was living smack dab in the middle of a godless society, wondering if God was paying attention to the rampant immorality and evil that was raging. He was also wondering why God would allow it to happen and wondering what could be done about it. The prophet Habakuk asked God the question many of us ask. How long O God? How much longer will you allow this to go on? The answer he received was not one he had expected or wanted to hear. God would use the Chaldeans, a nation even more violent and wicked than his own to carry out divine judgment. In the mind of Habakuk that seemed out of character for a loving and just God. Why must all of God's people suffer because of the actions of some? Why would God judge evil people with even greater evil people?

Can you relate to this man with the funny sounding name who lived more than 2600 years ago? Are we like Habakkuk or even Francis Scott Key sitting on the ramparts in the twilights last gleaming searching for a glimpse of hope- a sign that God is still on the throne and that good will triumph over evil when the battle is over? Have we ever asked God similar questions or cried out for help and concluded that God wasn't listening? God, do you hear me? Do you hear us? How long do we have to wait for an answer? Certainly, those are worthy questions deserving of a worthy response. They are difficult questions, and it matters not whether Habakkuk or those of us living thousands of years later are the ones asking they will never be too difficult for God to answer. In fact, those questions and others like them have been answered time and time again in Scriptures. The problem is that people continue to seek different answers.

If you are tempted to throw your hands in the air and give up the fight against evil, consider what God said to Habakuk and is saying to us in Habakuk chapter 2. Allow me to paraphrase: Don't think for minute that I have abandoned you. You and everyone else seeking justice must wait until all things are ready and in place. Trust me when I say it will be worth the wait. Don't be discouraged by those who babble on and refuse to hear what I am saying. You must ignore them with the knowledge that I will deal with them at exactly the right time. I am still on the throne, and I always will be. My love for you will become even more evident as the days go on. Stay faithful and leave the rest up to me.

Let us hear and heed those words.... Pastor Greg
